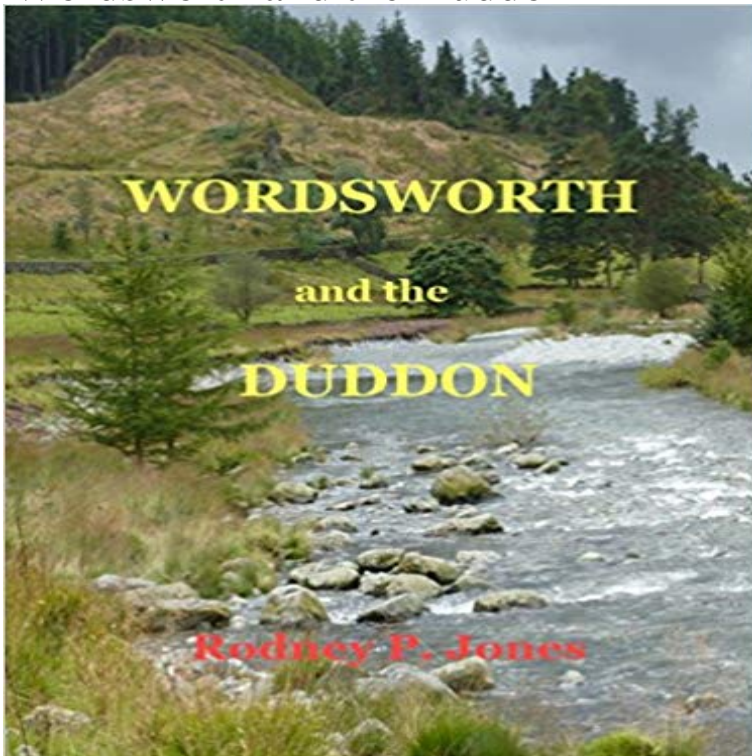


Wordsworth and the Duddon



In this modest volume the author reflects on the Sequence of Sonnets concerning the River Duddon which, together with his poem Vaudracour and Julia and prose travelogue A Topographical Description of the Country of the Lakes, Wordsworth published in April 1820. Although William Wordsworth had now reached his 50th year, this publication was his first real commercial success as a poet. The Duddon Sonnets are somewhat neglected today and his modern popularity rests largely with the Lyrical Ballads - partly a collaboration with Coleridge - and his autobiographical poem The Prelude. The sonnet sequence provides an enchanting description of the River and its environs as it falls from its source among the Central Fells of Cumbria to the Irish Sea, as well as providing a master-class in the art of the Sonneteer. In these reflections, the possible geographical location of most of the sonnets is identified, and explanatory background notes are provided. Unfortunately, without these notes, many of the sonnets cannot fully be understood. The book is intended for the general reader of Wordsworth's poetry and the author has made every effort to make it as accessible as possible but, it has to be admitted, a good deal of Wordsworth's later poetry lacks the simplicity of expression and freedom from classical allusion that he had advocated in his famous Preface to the Lyrical Ballads. Where such stylistic delinquencies are found, as full an explanation is given while hopefully avoiding either a hectoring or didactic tone. Too many students have been deterred from attaining a greater acquaintance with poetry, as a result of experiences in the classroom.
